### **Golden Classics with Nancy Sit & Friends at RWG**

Concert on 28 October also features Raymond Cho, Michael Lai and Karen Tong

**Genting Highlands, 03 August 2017** - Lovers of classic Chinese songs can enjoy a wonderful walk down memory lane at a concert featuring four veteran Hong Kong stars this coming October at Resorts World Genting. Featuring Nancy Sit, Michael Lai Siu-Tin, Raymond Cho and Karen Tong, the concert will no doubt help such fans rediscover the beauty of timeless music.

Nancy Sit & Friends: Golden Classics Let's Get High Concert Live in Genting, to be held at the Arena of Stars on 28 October 2017, 8.30pm, will see the stars delivering light-hearted banter and songs that produce nostalgia—just the kind of entertainment that would make for an enjoyable evening.

The four stars are hosts of the TV programme, *Cantopop at 50*, of which Lai is also music director. The programme that first aired in February this year enjoys a huge following of its own, featuring classic songs delivered by the original singers or invited artistes doing cover versions.

All four stars have expressed happiness about the good fan response to their upcoming show at Resorts World Genting, and look forward to performing for their fans. They will be delivering their own songs for the concert.

Nancy Sit, of course, needs no introduction, having become a household name since the 1960s when she was a popular teen idol alongside stars like Josephine Siao and Connie Chan Po-chu. She juggled acting and singing, recording many albums over the years and even serving as a mentor to Anita Mui, who went on to become one of the biggest superstars ever in Hong Kong's entertainment industry.

Cementing Nancy's staying power are various accolades: she was the first actress to be awarded the Outstanding Women Professionals Award at the Outstanding Women Professionals and Entrepreneurs Awards 2014, an event organised by the Hong Kong Women Professionals & Entrepreneurs Association. The TVB variety show, *Walk the Walk, Talk the Talk* that she hosted with Wong Cho Lam, was also awarded My Favourite TVB Variety/Infotainment Programme and My Favourite TVB Variety Show Host at the StarHub Awards 2014 in Singapore.

Like Nancy, Raymond Cho is a seasoned entertainer, having been a television star for many years. Currently working for TVB, Raymond started out as a singer; he stamped his mark after having won a singing competition when he was 29 years old. Ironically, his singing career didn't take off, so he decided to give acting a try—which led to his joining TVB. Among the notable dramas he has starred in are *Healing Hands II*, *Healing Hands III*, *Welcome to the House*, and *At Home with Love*.

Cho married Elaine Chiang, the eldest daughter of Hong Kong actor David Chiang, in 2007, and their son, Brandon, was born a year later, followed by their daughter, Erin, three years later.

For his part, Michael Lai Siu-Tin, who is also known as Lai Tin-Ying, has also enjoyed a successful career as an actor and composer. Previously married to Susanna Kwan, he is best known for the 1985 film, *Police Story*, *Project A 2*, and *What to Do Without Love*.

Rounding off the team is actress Karen Tong, who is best known for such films as *Running on Karma*, *Whispers and Moans*, and *San Sam Long: Foon Cheung Tou Foo*.

Tickets for the concert are priced at RM510 (VIP), RM390 (PS1), RM290 (PS2), RM190 (PS3), and RM100 (PS4); excluding RM4 processing fee. Genting Rewards Card (GRC) members are entitled to a 10% discount when they purchase tickets by cash or credit card, and Genting Points redemption. This is applicable for all price scales.
